The Citrus Ridge County Library invites everyone to its Annual Holiday Party on Saturday, December 9, from 1 to 3p.m.

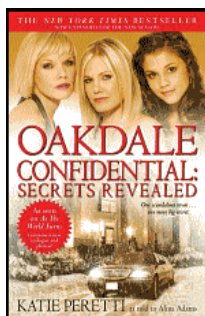
The event, featuring cookie decorating and holiday crafts, will be highlighted by a visit from Santa who will be present until 2p.m.
